

New Jersey State Continuing Education requirements:

Effective January 1, 2010, to renew your NJS registration as a Chiropractor, you are required to complete 30 hours of NJ Board approved continuing education credits in each two-year registration period (9/1 odd year – 8/31 of the following odd year).

- Of the 30 total hours, a minimum 2 hours **must** be in the following: Ethics, RecordKeeping/Documentation, Boundaries Issues, Risk Management, NJ Law, Insurance Reporting Procedures and/or Medical/Legal.
- Of the 30 total hours, a minimum 2 hours **must** be in Nutrition.
- The remaining hours may be in either of the above categories or General topics.
- A live webinar is a real-time, interactive, internet based program & is therefore considered equivalent to a live classroom course in NJS. A recorded webinar is available online and considered distance learning.
- You may take up to 12 hours via a distance learning format (e.g. internet based online or recorded webinars).

The law reads as follows:

A minimum of two of the 30 credits shall consist of the study of State laws and regulations governing chiropractic professional ethics or record keeping and documentation as it pertains to the practice of chiropractic in this State, and a minimum of two credits shall consist of nutrition education.

If a doctor exceeds the 30 credits within the two-year registration period, up to 7 credits of any category may be “carried-over” to the next two-year registration period.

50 minutes = 1 CE hour

Instructors can receive up to 12 CE for instructing a course per licensure period.

Up to 10 hours’ worth of CE credits can be offered/received on one day.

All courses must be applied to and approved by NJS no less than 30 days prior to the course date.
